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A blood alcohol level might be helpful in the office if the patient appears intoxicated but is denying alcohol abuse. A blood alcohol level in excess of 300 mg/dL, a blood alcohol level of greater than 150 mg/dL without gross evidence of intoxication, or a blood alcohol level of greater than 100 mg/dL upon routine examination indicates alcoholism with a high degree of reliability.
